

## Take Spring Cleaning Outdoors and Spruce Up Your Sprinklers

Spring is often a time for tackling those tough chores indoors. But you can also save water and money outdoors with a little sprinkler spruce up this season. If you have an irrigation system, chances are it has been dormant for the past several months. Take a few minutes to check your system for common problems, such as leaks or malfunctioning sprinkler heads.

*Inspect* – Check your system for clogged, broken, or missing sprinkler heads. If you're not the do—it-yourself type, go with a pro—look for an irrigation professional certified through the Oregon Landscape Contractors Board to help you maintain your system.

**Connect** – Examine points where the sprinkler heads connect to pipes or hoses. If water pools in your landscape or you have large wet areas, you could have a leak in your system. A leak about as small as the tip of a ballpoint pen can waste as much as 6,300 gallons (840 cubic feet) of water per month.

*Direct* – Are you watering the driveway, house, or sidewalk instead of your yard? Redirect sprinklers to apply water only to the landscape.

**Select** – An improperly scheduled irrigation controller can waste a lot of water and money. Update your system's schedule every two weeks throughout

the summer and turn the system off if rain is in the forecast. Call (541) 552-2057 during the watering season for updated weather and controller scheduling information.

## Let's Plant Responsibly: Ashland's Wildfire Safety Ordinance

Recent wildfires have taken a toll on friends and family in California, and we are asking what we can do to prevent wildfire home loss here. One piece of the puzzle was put in place in October 2018, when the City took a necessary step towards being wildfire adapted and adopted a resolution that restricts new plantings of flammable plant species within 30 feet of any building in town.

Resolution 2018-28 identifies known flammable plant species that are best planted away from buildings. If you are thinking about re-landscaping your yard or getting a few new plants in the ground this winter, please be aware of this list. The species are listed to the right, and there is a more comprehensive list with photos at www.ashland.or.us/wildfiresafetyordinance. Exceptions may be granted by Ashland Fire & Rescue for dwarf or prostrate varieties of these species (with an \*) planted beyond five feet from any structure, and that follow tree or shrub spacing guidelines as defined in the General Fuel Modification Area Standards in Chapter 18.3.10.100.

This regulation was put in place to reduce Ashland's wildfire risk by creating defensible space around buildings and promoting fire resistant landscaping, both during new construction and for any new plantings close to buildings. ## You Still Have Time to Apply for the City's Electric and **Hybrid Electric Vehicle Incentive!**

## What incentives are currently available?

Ashland Electric customers may choose one of the options below:

- Qualifying new or used Battery Electric Vehicle: \$300
- Qualifying new or used Plug-in Hybrid Electric Vehicle: \$200
- Qualifying Workplace EV Charger: \$500

#### Am I eligible?

All Ashland Municipal Electric Customers are eligible to apply for the vehicle incentives. A workplace charging incentive is available for commercial electric accounts only. Vehicles must be purchased (or new vehicle lease signed) during the pilot program window, between September 1, 2018 and March 31, 2019.

## Household Hazardous Waste Drop-Off Day

For a minimum of \$5, Rogue Transfer and Recycling will take your first cubic yard of hazardous waste (equal to six 32 gallon trash cans). Items that are accepted include: cleaning supplies (window cleaner, drain cleaner, bathroom cleaner, anything containing bleach or ammonia), pesticides and insecticides, swimming pool chemicals, weed killers not currently approved for use, paint remover, old or toxic wood preservatives, light ballasts, alkaline and rechargeable batteries, and thermostats containing mercury.
