<u>Resolution Confirming Jurisdictional Qualification for State Subventions and Resolution to Receive State Funds</u> Council certifies that the City qualifies for subventions (revenues shared by the state) by resolution each year. Additionally, Council annually adopts a resolution electing to receive an apportionment of the Oregon Department of Administrative Services General Fund revenues derived from taxes imposed as part of state revenue sharing. These are both necessary steps in the 2021-23 budget process.
