August is vacation month...don't get caught off guard

Nature has already made the summer of 2012 historic in several ways and extreme heat and drought continues in many parts of the country. Severe storms and record wildfires have left many residents vulnerable to flooding as well. The recent wildfires have sadly impacted many lives, burned homes and structures, and left landscapes blackened. Natural hazards can happen at any time; be prepared.

Knowledge first:

Familiarize yourself with your surroundings when traveling to your vacation destination; common things to consider knowing include where emergency facilities are located, evacuation maps and other route information, and all hazards/threats related to the location and how best to mitigate the impacts during travel.

It takes just seconds:

Pick up a few extra containers of water and food for your trip in case of emergency. When car packing don't remove your "go-kit" even though it may take up a bit of space it may be the best use of space in your vehicle.

Third person contact:

Let someone know your itinerary and keep a schedule of check-in times to let them know you are okay. If you have an out-of-the-area contact use it along with a local contact to ensure your safety can be effectively communicated.

We live in earthquake territory; don't let your guard down! Disaster preparedness month is just around the corner. Keep an eye open for updates for the **CERTain Disaster Expo** scheduled Saturday, September 9th to learn more about natural disasters and how to be better prepared when disaster strikes.

Attendees will gain information on how to build an emergency supply kit and what should be included in your kit, purchasing disaster supplies at local retailers, learn about the Map Your Neighborhood program, gain an understanding of what CERT is, what we do, and how it relates to you and your community. There will be activities for the kiddos and information on pet safety. Many organizations from around the valley are expected to attend.

Base Update



Special thanks to those who volunteered to paint the base rooftops. The first coat of elastromeric coating was applied to each of the five Ashland CERT bases. Volunteers spent six hours Saturday, July 7th coating the roofs to provide more than 80% reflective properties from the sun's rays and provide cooling to the inside of the base and contents. If you are interested in taking

part in the second coat application process sometime in August please contact the CERT office.

Base file boxes will soon represent current Incident Command Systems (ICS) forms and files to coincide with Ashland Fire Department and other emergency response agencies across the U.S. The ICS structure enables emergency responders the ability to integrate through a standardized structure to enhance response management and communication regardless of incident complexity. The system is now used for all incident scopes regardless of size in both the private and public sectors providing a uniform response mechanism for management.

Many of the CERT forms have been swapped with the appropriate ICS forms to align with other emergency response agencies including Ashland Fire & Rescue. Training and familiarity of these forms will be presented at general meetings on an on-going basis.

CERT Members receive \$10 discount toward CPR classes at AFR

In 2011 the American Heart Association (AHA) announced new research driven training standards for CPR. Ashland Fire and Rescue offers monthly First Aid/CPR/AED classes with certification through AHA. If you are a CERT member and are interested in taking a certification class you will receive a \$10 discount. Being prepared makes sense and with this discount preparedness is even more affordable. To sign up for any CPR certification class at AFR and / or for more information about the discount simply contact Ashland CERT.

American Heart Association First Aid / CPR / AED class

HeartSaver First Aid, CPR, AED, is a classroom, video-based, instructor-led course that teaches students critical skills needed to respond to and manage a first aid, choking or sudden cardiac arrest emergency in the first few minutes until emergency medical services (EMS) arrives. Students learn skills such as how to treat bleeding, sprains, broken bones, shock and other first aid emergencies. This course also teaches adult CPR and AED use.

The cost for this course is \$55, which includes a student study book and card*. The class takes approximately 8 hours to complete. All fees must be prepaid prior to the class date to confirm reservation. Please register early to reserve your space

*Upon successful completion, students will receive an American Heart Association HeartSaver First Aid, CPR, AED Course Completion Card that is valid for two years. When: August 11th, 2012 Where: Ashland Fire Station 1
