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

## Faces of Ashland CERT campaign member profile

Continuing on with the Ashland CERT member profile campaign "Faces of CERT" series this month the feature member is **Annette Heron**. Annette was born April 6, 1959. She has extensive background in supporting the CERT community and beyond. Since graduating from basic training Annette has immersed herself attending various trainings such as Spontaneous Volunteer Management and running the Ashland Emergency Operations Center. Annette frequently attends meetings as well.

The intent of the campaign is to inform Ashland residents of CERT while making community connections. The campaign also encourages networking and outreach between existing members. Here is one dedicated volunteer's story to another. Let's get to know Annette.

Where are you from and when did you move to Ashland?: I am from Winston-Salem, North Carolina, and moved to Ashland, OR on August 17, 2012. Although I lived most of my life in North Carolina, Oregon feels more like home than North Carolina. I hope to make Ashland a permanent home.



What attracted you to Ashland?: In July 2012, I accepted a position with the Oregon Department of Public Health through AmeriCorps\*VISTA to work at the Jackson County Medical Reserve Corps as the MRC Volunteer Coordinator.

What is/was your career?: I have a Masters degree in Health Psychology, a branch of psychology that addresses how behaviors (i.e. social, psychological, and biological) causes biological illnesses and diseases. Health Psychology also has a public health component, in that it is based on the health promotion and disease prevention model.

As the MRC Volunteer Coordinator with the Jackson County Medical Reserve Corps, Annette works with the MRC Unit Coordinator to recruit and prepare volunteers to respond to disasters by providing free trainings in CPR & AED, START Triage, Psychological First Aid, Radiation Protection, Risk Management, Medical Skills, ADLS & BDLS, etc.

The MRC also collaborates with multiple partners to educate the community about disaster preparedness and response, and public health issues such as the flu and H1N1. As an AmeriCorps\*VISTA, I work with other Oregon VISTAs on projects to address poverty such as Project CONNECT (also known as Project Homeless Connect).

Hobbies, interests, favorite movie, food, etc?: Although I enjoy quiet time when I can get it, I am very active in my church as a member of the Humanitarian Team. In this position, I help fight against poverty by managing the church food bin for the Ashland Food Project, and working with other church leaders to support church teachings on disaster preparedness. I also love physical fitness, a good movie, and intelligent conversations. My favorite foods are antioxidant foods.

How did you first learn about Ashland CERT?: I learned about Ashland CERT shortly after I began my position with the Jackson County MRC. I graduated from Ashland CERT on November 13, 2012.

What did you like best about the CERT basic training?: The best thing about the CERT training was the disaster simulation sequence on the last day. Since graduating I have been diligent about attending training opportunities offered by Ashland CERT and other disaster response organizations to keep my skills fresh.

What do you find most interesting about Ashland CERT?: I was most impressed with Terri Eubanks, the CERT Program Coordinator. Terri represents well and works very hard to make sure our team has the best and latest training opportunities available.

Why did you choose to be a CERT member?: I chose to become a CERT member because disaster preparedness and recovery is the most fulfilling and rewarding work I have ever done, outside of positions I have held in the church I am a member of.

What other programs in the Ashland community do you support?: None in the Ashland community. But other programs/organizations in Jackson County I support include Una Voz of Southern Oregon, Oregon Vulnerable Populations Emergency Preparedness Coalition (VPEPC), Community Organizations Active in a Disaster (COAD), American Red Cross, Oregon Health Authority, Citizen Corps, hospitals, faith-based organizations, and other emergency response organizations.

What do like best about the community?: The first thing that stood out about Ashland when I moved here, was that there were no fast-food restaurants in the city, and that it is a health-conscious community. I was also impressed that the community promotes sustainability. And I was also amazed that such a small community can offer a great variety of social activities from the Shakespeare Festival to hiking.

# Map Your Neighborhood meets Firewise

Ashland CERT is partnering with Ashland Firewise to present Map Your Firewise Neighborhood (MYFN). This collaboration will blend the 9-step process from the traditional MYN program with the 5-steps necessary for a neighborhood to become a recognized Firewise community. Because some of the MYN steps greatly mirror Firewise steps the process will likely continue with 10-11 steps to become a MYFN. This program will be offered in addition to the already popular MYN and Firewise recognition. If unified communities would like the opportunity to complete one of the programs in addition to a program they have already completed we will be offering some priority to those neighborhoods. For example, if you have a strong MYN and would like to explore the possibility of becoming Firewise as well we can invite those same trusty neighbors to get involved in the Firewise process and vice versa. Both MYN and Firewise promote social unity and structures for preparedness, self-sufficiency and leadership among neighbors. We hope this model can be used by other communities in the future to assist in readiness using Ashland as their model. ## American Heart Association Adult CPR certification class

HeartSaver CPR is a classroom, video based, instructor led course that teaches adult CPR and AED use, as well as how to relieve choking on an adult. This course teaches skills with American Heart Association's research-proven Practice-While-Watching technique, which allows instructors to observe the students, provide feedback and guide the students' learning of skills.

This course is for anyone with limited or no medical training seeking a course completion card in CPR and AED use to meet job, regulatory, and/or other requirements.

The cost for this course is \$35, which includes a student study book and card\*. The class takes approximately 3 hours to complete. All fees must be prepaid prior to the class date to confirm reservation. Please register early to reserve your space.

\*Upon successful completion, students will receive an American Heart Association HeartSaver CPR Course Completion Card that is valid for two years.
