## 2010 Census


The U.S. Constitution

(Article I, Section 2) mandates a headcount every 10 years, of everyone residing in the

United States: in all 50 states, Puerto Rico, and the Island Areas. This includes people of all ages, races, ethnic groups, citizens, and noncitizens. The first census was conducted in 1790 and has been carried out every 10 years since then.

The 2010 Census kicks off in March. Residents can expect to receive letters in early March notifying them that the census forms will arrive between March 15 – 17. The 2010 form is a short form — just 10 questions.

## Car Seat Installation

Ashland Fire & Rescue is offering child safety seat installations to the public. If you are interested in having a child safety seat installed, contact Ashland Fire & Rescue at 482-2770 during normal business hours (Monday through Friday, 8-5) to schedule an appointment.

The installation of the child safety seat is free and will teach you how to install the car seat correctly. Low cost child safety seats are available to those who are unable to afford one.

According to Safe Kids Worldwide, properly installed child safety seats increase a child's chance of surviving a vehicle accident by 80%. Adults are encouraged to set the example to their children by using seatbelts. Statistics indicate that children are more likely to use proper restraints when parents also use the proper safety restraints.

***Remember to use the following installation tips when installing the child safety seat yourself:***

## Ragland Award Volunteer Spirit Community Service Award

Each year, the Mayor and City Council recognize an Ashland citizen for their volunteer spirit and contribution to the Ashland community.

The Volunteer Spirit Community Service Award was established by the Mayor and Council in 1994 in honor of James M. Ragland. Mr. Ragland was a former councilor and planning commissioner who was involved in numerous citizen volunteer efforts.

A committee of the Mayor and Council review the nominations and determine the annual award winner. Criteria is based on public sector volunteer service performed,

length of service, absence of adequate recognition in the past, and any other attributes the nominee may have that should be considered. Consideration is also given to people who volunteer hours beyond their regular work day to perform a service which benefits the community.

The award is given annually during the second City Council meeting in April each year. This year's award will be presented at the April 20, 2010 Council meeting.

The information collected is used to draw congressional districts and to allocate Electoral College votes to the states. Congress also uses the count to distribute more than \$300 billion each year in federal aid to state, local and tribal governments.

***The Federal government uses population data to allocate funds in a number of areas:***

- Title 1 grants to school districts
- Head Start programs
- Women, Infants, and Children (WIC and food grants)
- Public transportation
- Road rehabilitation and construction
- Programs for the elderly
- Emergency food and shelter
- Empowerment zones

The data will help the private sector as well as State and Federal governments determine where jobs and job programs are needed.

***Additionally:***

- Census data helps potential homeowners research property values, median income, and other demographic information about a particular community.
- Corporations use population data for market research to determine locations for commercial enterprises, such as food stores, pharmacies, and other essential services.

Census information is protected by law, and everyone who works for the census must swear that they

will never disclose any personal information. Penalties for any employee who might share that information are severe: up to five years in prison and a \$250,000 fine. By law, the Census Bureau can't share your information with anyone — including other Federal agencies and law enforcement. Your information is safe.

seat is properly installed.

- Rear facing child safety seats can never be installed in front of an airbag.
- Infants should be in a rear-facing child safety seat up to one year and 20 pounds.
- Forward facing child safety seats should utilize a five-point harness up to 40 pounds.
- Booster seats should be used until the child fits a lap and shoulder belt correctly. ▼
