Flood Insurance Study
Revisions

A Flood Insurance Study revision has recently been completed for Jackson County,



Oregon, including the City of Ashland. This revision was prepared by the U.S. Department of Homeland Security's Federal Emergency Management Agency (FEMA). This revision updates the Flood Insurance Rate Maps (FIRMs) showing the areas that would be inundated by the one percent annual chance flood (Base Flood or 100- year flood).

New digital maps will be used by federally-regulated lending institutions and insurance agents in determining who must purchase flood insurance and (See *Flood Insurance Study Revisions*, Page 2)

the cost of that insurance, should it be necessary. In addition, the maps will be used by city and county officials for floodplain management and permitting purposes.

The people most directly affected by the issuance of this study are those owning property and/or living in the identified flood hazard areas. Interested persons are invited to a Public Forum on April 14 from 5:00 — 6:30 p.m. at the Community Development Building, Siskiyou Room to review the revised Flood Insurance Study (FIS) and Flood Insurance Rate Maps (FIRM). The maps are also available for review at the Commu-

nity Development Building located at 51 Winburn Way.

Spring Cleaning

Tree branches and bushes that extend onto city streets and sidewalks pose hazards for pedestrians, bicyclists and vehicles. Larger vehicles such as delivery trucks, street sweepers and RVs can sustain damage when coming into contact with tree branches — and trees can sustain damage if branches are broken.

Property owners are responsible for trimming trees or bushes



adjacent to the street and their property. This includes the park row area between the sidewalk and the curb.

To determine if your trees need trimming, stand on the curb line in front of your home, look up and see if there are any branches extending beyond the curb into the street under 14 feet or 8 feet over sidewalks. If so, these branches should be trimmed back to the curb line.

Bushes and shrubs should also be trimmed to allow passengers to easily exit a parked car and to allow pedestrians the full width of the sidewalk.
