SUMMARY

Deployment of 5G cellular technology is being ramped up amid promises by providers of breakthrough new services. Yet there are concerns in other quarters about its ramifications, which include health risks, violation of citizens' privacy and pre-emption of local government control. Recent rules issued the Federal Communications Commission to expedite 5G deployment are being challenged in court by a number of major cities, including Portland, but the ultimate decision may end up in the hands of Congress.

Given previous citizen interest in cellular technology's effects in our community, including a Council decision in 2012 to offer an "opt out" policy for radio frequency (RF) meters and thus RF meter reading, an informational presentation of this complex issue seemed appropriate.

POLICIES, PLANS & GOALS SUPPORTED

Enhance and Improve Transparency and Communication
