



## **CITY MANAGER'S OFFICE:**

- The Jackson County NHMP (Natural Hazards Mitigation Plan) is pending adoption by local councils and Jackson County Commissioners. Ashland has their own annex, which assesses the City's highest risks associated with natural hazards, and wildfire is number one. The Plan was updated and revised summer 2023 by local stakeholders, including **Kelly Burns**, and with assistance by a team at OSU. The Plan is scheduled to be presented to Ashland City Council on February 20, 2024.
- New school safety protocols adopted. The Standard Response Protocol (from the "iloveuguys" foundation) was approved by the Ashland School District (ASD). Kelly Burns worked with ASD administration to bring this program to the district. - The City launched a Communication Survey in late January. The survey will be available through March 1, 2024. The goal of the survey is to determine how the citizens of Ashland want to be communicated with. - Staff met with representatives from, "The Ashland Welcoming Voices Project." This project is an effort to expand opportunities to establish supportive business and community relationships for citizens and visitors of Ashland and will include members from marginalized groups (BIPOC/LGBTQ+). More to come in late spring/early summer.
- Behind the scenes work on the new CivicPlus website for the City continues. In late January, all City departments met with a representative from CivicPlus to discuss content that will be migrated to the new site. Target launch date is mid to late May 2024.
