My name is Daniel Cooke. I am a resident of Ashland, OR, and I am a very enthusiastic supporter of Ashland Parks and Recreation, especially the North Mountain Park Nature Center. NMPNC is a wonderful expression of how the citizens of Ashland adore our natural surroundings here in Southern Oregon. The staff is brilliant and the programs & celebrations for both children and adults are the highest quality. The "Otter Fence" which I am prepared to donate to this project is a hard-wood art piece with an estimated value of \$10,000.
