The Ashland Watershed

Ashland, Oregon

About the Watershed

The Ashland Watershed contains the municipal water supply for the city of Ashland, Oregon and is jointly managed by the city and the U.S. Forest Service, one of only a few such partnerships in the country. Within the Watershed are historical sites such as the Winburn property, as well as many threatened or endangered species such as the Northern Spotted Owl, Pacific Fisher, and the Mt. Ashland Lupine. The Watershed lies within the Siskiyou Mountains, which are generally considered to be the most ecologically diverse forested area in the country.

The Watershed is protected by a partnership between the City of Ashland and other stakeholders through community partnerships, the Ashland Forest Resiliency (AFR) and the Ashland Forest Lands Commission (AFLC).

Recreation

Because of sensitive fire, flood, and water quality concerns in the Ashland Watershed, please observe recreational rules:

- ✓ Bike only on marked trails
- ✓ Hike only on marked trails
- ✓ Swim only in designated areas of Ashland Creek
- ✗ No camping

- Average precipitation, Mt. Ashland: 60"
- City population: ~22,000 in 2010
- City average max. temperature, Jul: 78.3° F
- City average max. temperature, Dec: 46.1° F
- Soil type: granitic, highly erosive
- Common native wildlife: cougar, black-tailed deer, black bear, bobcat, screech owl, coyote, fox, rabbit
- Common native flora: ponderosa pine, madrone, Douglas fir, oaks, lupine, Henderson's horkelia
- Major fires: 1901, 1910, 1959, 2009 and 2010
- Major floods: 1964, 1974, and 1997
