



Be Winter Wise – Winterize Your Irrigation System!

With colder temperatures and so much on our minds during the holiday season, it's easy to overlook maintaining our irrigation systems. So, remember to double check to be sure your irrigation system has been completely turned off for the winter season and that you have prepared it for cold temperatures. The best way to protect your irrigation investment from potential freeze damage over the winter season is to "winterize" all system components. This process involves removing water from pipes, valves and sprinkler heads before freezing occurs.

Follow these basic steps to assist you in winterizing your irrigation system:

- First, shut off water to your sprinkler system. If there isn't a valve to isolate the irrigation system from the main household supply, consider adding one.
- Next, turn on each of the sprinkler valves to release the pressure in the pipes.
- Then, drain sprinkler components as much as possible. Remove the cap and riser from the highest and lowest sprinkler in each irrigation zone to help water drain out.
- Some systems are equipped to be blown out with compressed air. Contact an irrigation professional who offers this service.

Low Income Assistance

The City of Ashland has funds available for the Ashland Low Income Energy Assistance Program, which assists low-income residents with electric bill costs during the cold winter months.

Eligible Ashland residents include those whose income is at or below 65 percent of Oregon's median income. These levels are based on household income and household size. Qualified recipients will receive a credit on their electric utility charges. Credits of up to 50 percent will be given to seniors and disabled persons for up to six months and credits of 50 percent to other qualified residents for up to three months. The maximum allowed credit is \$300.00 for either group.

Beginning October 2, applicants may call the request line at 541-552-2038 to request a Low Income Assistance application packet or may pick one up at the Utility Billing Counter at City Hall.

If you know of someone who might qualify and needs assistance, please let them know about this program. The deadline to submit the application is January 31, 2018.



Use good fire to fight bad fire

An essential part of the solution to severe summer wildfires and suffocating smoke is more controlled burning during cool seasons. Scientific studies show that fuel reduction followed by controlled burns are most effective at reducing wildfire impacts, while making firefighters safer.

Wildfires burn more fuel per acre and emit significantly more smoke than controlled burns, nearly ten times as much in all. Tolerating lesser amounts of smoke for short periods is an essential strategy to one day experience less smoke during the summer, and absolutely imperative to protect our community and water supply from severe wildfire.

James M. Ragland Volunteer Spirit Award

Each year, the Mayor and City Council recognize an Ashland citizen for their volunteer spirit and contribution to the Ashland community. The Volunteer Spirit Community Service Award was established by the Mayor and Council in 1994, in honor of James M. Ragland. Mr. Ragland was a former city councilor and planning commissioner who was involved in numerous citizen volunteer efforts.

The Mayor and Council review the nominations and determine the annual winner. Criteria for nomination and selection are based on public sector volunteer service performed, length of service, absence of adequate recognition in the past, and any other attributes the nominee may have that should be considered. Consideration is also given to people who volunteer hours beyond their reg-

ular work day to perform a service that benefits the community.

The award is given annually. This year it will be given at the January 30, 2018, State of the City and Volunteer Recognition event (more information on this event to follow).

- After purging the system of all water, leave all the valves on your backflow preventer half open.
- Finally, turn your sprinkler controller to the off position.
- In addition, any above ground piping, backflow preventers and valves need to be insulated. Disconnect garden hoses and place insulation caps on hose bibs.

Properly preparing your system for the winter can be far less costly than repairing damaged equipment in the spring. Consider contacting an irrigation professional to assist you with winterizing your system.
