SUMMARY

At the January 5, 2021 Council Business Meeting, Mayor Akins put forward a request and plan for a Wildfire Town Hall to be held on January 14, 2021 to provide a venue to hear from the community directly in addition to the online survey opportunity that was completed in November. Upon further discussion as a body, it was determined that the event should occur in February or March to provide more time for staff preparation, public noticing, and potential involvement of the Wildfire Safety Commission in the event.

To properly prepare and publicize the event, staff is requesting direction on the desired structure and content of the event, as well as agreement on the date and time for the (zoom) event.

BACKGROUND AND ADDITIONAL INFORMATION

Major themes for the event that have been discussed by Council include the following:

- What has happened/is happening post-fire in Ashland
- Summary presentation of November online survey (500+ responses)
- Status on key issues (I-5 emergency access, evacuation traffic study, communications, etc)
- Attendee Q & A (either live or via chat) This could occur at several spots in the event agenda
- Presentation on existing City programming for residents
- New/expanded efforts currently underway (could be spot for Wildfire Commission)
- Action Steps for residents before next wildfire season

An initial date of February 17 was tentatively assigned for this event. It was recently brought to staff's attention that the State Legislative House Special Committee on Wildfire Recovery is conducting a Wildfire Recovery Public Hearing for Southern Oregon on that night so staff is suggesting an event date of either February 24 or March 3 or 10 from 6:00 to 8:00 PM.

FISCAL IMPACTS

Event costs are primarily for staff preparation of presentation materials, event outreach/marketing and other similar standard (zoom) event logistics.
