INTERNET ACCESS AT HOME

Affordable Connectivity Program

fcc.gov/acp, 877-384-2575

The Federal Communications Commission (FCC) offers this program to help low-income households get broadband. Through a participating internet provider, eligible households get a discount of up to \$30 per month toward internet service (or up to \$75 per month for households on qualifying Tribal lands).

- Visit <u>fcc.gov/acp</u> to check your eligibility.
- If eligible, go to <u>GetInternet.gov</u> to submit an application or print out a mail-in application.
- Contact a participating provider to select a plan and have the discount applied to your bill. They may ask you to complete their own application. Ask for a plan that is \$30 or less, and your whole bill will be covered.

Eligible households can also receive a one-time discount of up to \$100 to purchase a laptop, desktop computer, or tablet from participating providers (co-pay required and restrictions apply).

Ashland Fiber Network (AFN)

AFN is not currently participating in the federal Affordable Connectivity Program due to lack of staffing to apply. But they do offer a discount for income-qualified seniors and disabled.

- <u>Income limit</u>: Customer must qualify for Ashland Senior Utility Assistance, a year-round discount for on Ashland utility bills for income-qualified persons 65+ or 60+ with disability.
- <u>Applying</u>: If customer is already enrolled in Ashland utility assistance, they should call AFN at 541-552-2222 to sign up for internet. AFN will verify utility discount on their end and arrange for service.

Senior Services Division (SSD) staff can help people apply for the year-round utility discount. If customer does not have utilities in their name, SSD staff will communicate directly with AFN manager to verify age and income qualification.

- <u>Fees</u>: \$25/mo for 25/3 Mb service, a slightly lower speed than AFN regular \$55/mo service. One-time fee of \$10 for installation.
- Equipment: AFN sells modems at their bulk buy cost of \$50. If this is still too much for senior, customer should talk to the staff, and they may be able to find a used one that they can give at no cost. They also rent modems for \$5/mo.

If customer wants to use wireless at their home, they must also purchase a wireless router. AFN suggests specific models on their website: <u>ashlandfiber.net</u>.
