

Wildfire Season is Here

Are you prepared for smoke?

Prepare for regional wildfire smoke before it arrives! In July or sooner, do the following so you are prepared for excessive smoke:

- ❑ Visit smokewiseashland.org or airnow.gov for Ashland's latest air quality conditions and learn options to protect your health during times of smoke.
- ❑ Purchase the right filters for your air filtration system. Using MERV 13 or higher filters is ideal, but they may not be compatible with HVAC systems in older homes. Make sure to have spare filters during times of smoke, as you may need to change them out during a smoke event.
- ❑ Consider purchasing a stand-alone air purifier unit, especially if you have young children, are an older adult or have a pre-existing condition including heart & lung disease, asthma, or COPD. Air purifiers are available at local hardware stores or online.
- ❑ Install weather stripping if you have leaky doors or windows to reduce the amount of smoke that enters your home.
- ❑ Window air conditioning units should not be used during a smoke event, as they cannot filter out unhealthy smoky air. Cover and seal the border of the unit to stop smoky air from getting inside.
- ❑ Purchase N-95 respirators and wear them properly. N95 or N100 respirators can offer some protection from harmful particulates found in smoke.
