

Development of a radiation monitoring program for public and residential spaces as proposed by petitioner has been requested to be placed on the ballot for the November 8, 2022 General Election for Jackson County.

CAPTION: Requirement to development monitoring program for public and residential spaces.

QUESTION: Shall the City of Ashland be required to develop a radiation monitoring program for public and residential spaces?

SUMMARY: This measure would require the City of Ashland to develop a program to monitor public spaces including, but not limited to, schools, hospitals, parks, and streets and residential spaces for hazardous levels of radio frequency and electro-magnetic field radiation in order to maintain a safe environment for its citizens. Citizens would have the ability to request that the City of Ashland test specific public and residential spaces within its corporate limits for hazardous levels of radio frequency and electro-magnetic field radiation, and the City would be required to test those spaces.

*Result of a "no" vote: Ashland would not be required to develop a radiation monitoring program.*

Any objections to the ballot title must be filed with circuit court within seven (7) business days pursuant to ORS 250.296.
