 - a) Chris Chambers: "Zonehaven got sidelined for the balance of fire season due in part to their messaging not being consistent with Oregon's evacuation protocols (they've only worked in CA and CO). There will be another team leader meeting (I'm one of them) so we'll get more info soon. The evaluation period is only one year, and we've had it for several months, so it will be interesting to see if Jackson and Deschutes counties recommend to Oregon to keep it and expand. The price tag is not cheap."

 - a) 1st camera was installed in Cave Junction. ODF has protection cameras. But Infared doesn't go very far. FEMA grant requires 25% match from participating cities. (\$10k per yr. per camera.)
 - b) The ODF camera system is more than adequate for Ashland and ODF will be installing another camera, likely on Mt Ashland. This will more than blanket our area and there is no need for the expense of the Alert Wildfire system.
